Eggs were on sale. It had a giant "50% off" sign on it and then a tiny line written in Chinese, saying that customers have to buy 2 dozens or more to qualify for this discount.

I parked my motorcycle and went inside and took 2 dozens of eggs and waited in line before the cash register. A Caucasian male probably in his 40s was also standing in front of me. He was holding 1 dozen of eggs in his hand and I guess he was also probably attracted to the store by the sign.

A few minutes later, when it was his

turn to pay, the cashier, a mid-aged woman also in her 40s, looked at his 12 eggs and told him that he had to buy 2 dozens or more to get the half-price discount, otherwise he had to pay for the original price. She was saying this in Chinese.

Puzzled by the price on the cash register, he asked her why she was asking him to pay for the original price when the sign outside is saying they're doing a 50% off discount. He was saying this in English.

She told him to grab another 12 eggs and then he would get his half price and they would both end up living happily forever. It's obvious that none of them understood what each other was saying and temper started going downhill rapidly. The egg shopper started to question why the cashier couldn't understand or communicate with others in basic English and he also couldn't understand why the supermarket hired her in the first place. And the cashier started to question why somebody who's living in the Chinese territory couldn't read simple words such as two dozens in Chinese and listen to simple words from a sincerely staff at the

當我後來拿著我買的特價雞蛋離開這間超級市場的時候,我有一種很不錯的感覺。我記得前一天晚上在電視上看見一名外交官在討論朝鮮六方會談的進度時,他說道:"只要我們能讓他們一齊坐下來,互相了解對方的觀點,就可能會有進展。"我覺得我總算也為促進澳門社會之中彼此的諒解付出了我的一點兒努力。

I felt I was doing my part to turn Macau into a society of understanding.
